

The City of Santa Rosa launched the Santa Rosa Forward project in 2020 to engage the community in a discussion on how we can ensure housing for all, improve neighborhood quality and connectivity, foster economic development, improve public health for all, create more equitable access to community amenities and services, enhance education, and reinforce environmental stewardship over the next 30 years.

As part of this project, the Project Team conducted an online survey between February and April 2021 that provided community members an opportunity to share initial ideas and discuss needs, concerns, and preferences for the future of Santa Rosa. The following is a summary of the methodology, process, and major comments and feedback from Community Survey #1. This feedback will be used by the Project Team and the City to help identify opportunities and challenges and inform the next phase in the General Plan Update process (Visioning).

Methodology

The Project Team conducted an online survey between February 18, 2021, and April 23, 2021. A total of **1,339 people** responded to the survey. This is an impressive response, especially since the survey was launched during the COVID-19 pandemic. To protect respondents' health, all outreach was conducted virtually. The survey link was available on the Project's website (www.santarosafoward.com/Survey-1), distributed to City contacts via email, and posted via traditional media and social media to engage the public while enforcing the shelter in place order.

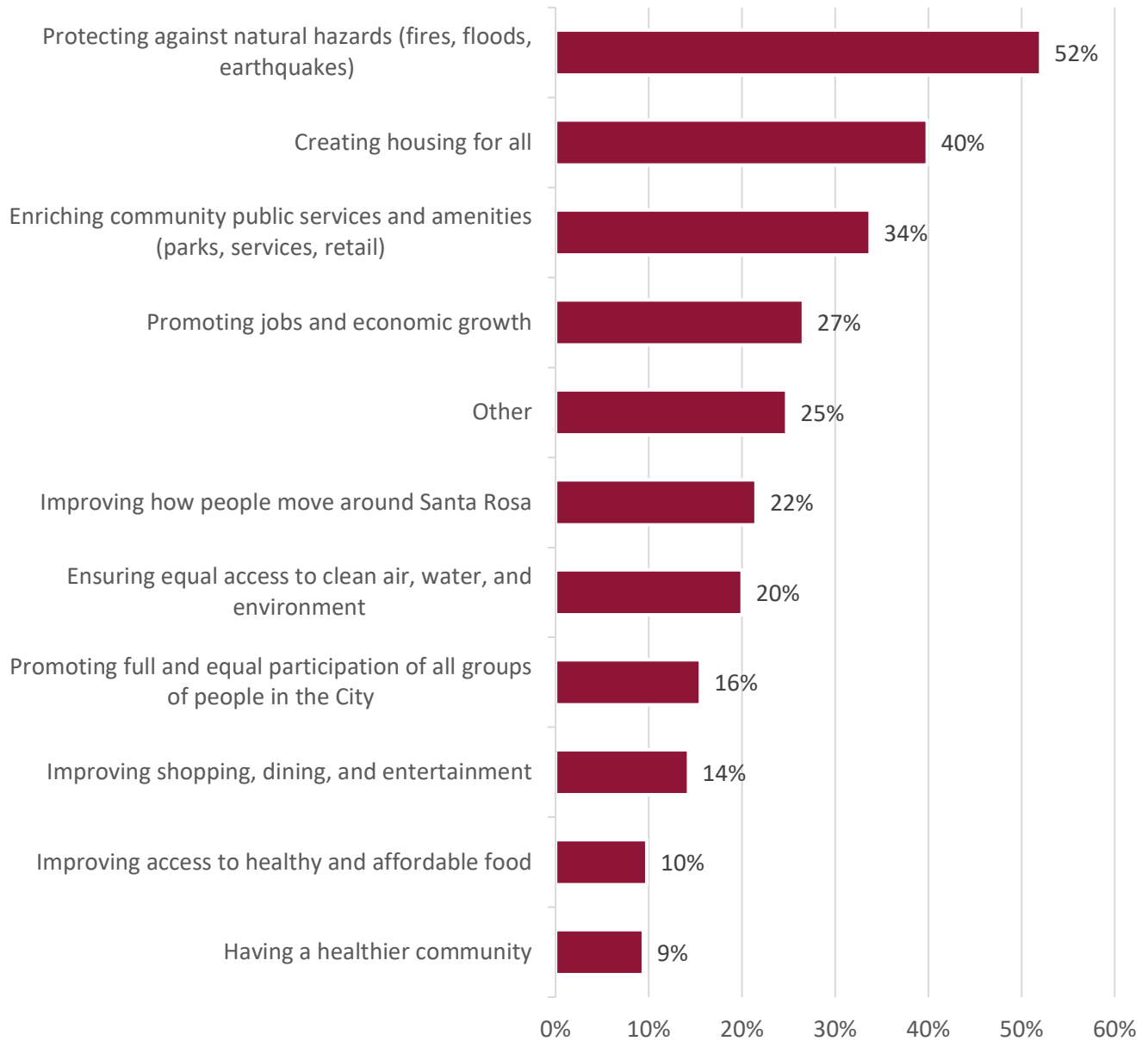
The survey included 24 questions and was made available in both English and Spanish. Nine surveys were completed in Spanish and the remaining 1,330 responses were completed in English. Several questions allowed participants to type or write in their response.

For each question, a letter “n” is provided to identify the number of respondents to that individual question (note, participants were not required to answer every question). This number is the basis of the percentages shown. The value for n varies for each question since respondents could skip questions when taking the survey. Also, some questions allowed participants to select two or more answer choices, resulting in total counts greater than the number of respondents and total percentages greater than 100%.

While the results should not be considered statistically valid for the entire Santa Rosa population, the findings are from a broad enough sample that they can help us to identify common themes and concerns when combined with the various community input activities conducted for the Santa Rosa Forward project.

Question 1

- Improving the quality of life in Santa Rosa.
- Supporting robust and effective Health Care.
- Mental health support, Substance abuse programs, Healthy Food Programs, Youth and senior activities and support, and cooling/smoky air relief shelters.
- Recruiting qualified and effective staff and decision makers.
- Better community representation.
- Strategic locations of housing and not overwhelming infrastructure.
- Improving walkability and bikeability.
- Improving and expanding infrastructure.
- Inviting gathering spaces, parks, streets, and sidewalks.
- Preserving existing facilities and cultural sites.
- Getting new/updated facilities.
- Restoring landscaping, homes, and businesses.
- Mitigating the impacts of homelessness: trash, hostility, community safety concerns, alternative services, semi-permeant encampments, basic needs, financial programming
- Using clean energy.
- Accountability and transparency with law enforcement.
- Preventing and decreasing Crime: Theft, DUIs, drug abuse, gangs, harassment.
- Safety concerns in Roseland, Coffey Park, and West Santa Rosa.
- Increasing communication and interagency coordination.
- Improve decision-making process and reporting process.

Share your thoughts on why you selected those changes?

Participants were also asked to share their thoughts on why they selected those changes or improvements. The following are the major or reoccurring comments that were identified by the community (see the appendix for all 355 individual comments).

Improving the quality of life

- Crime: disrespect, drugs, gang activity, theft
- Emergency preparedness and recovery
- Up to dated and sustainable Infrastructure (roads, electric, water, parks, libraries services, public transportation, childcare, etc.)
- Climate change and pollution
- Revitalize neglected spaces
- Attracting tourist
- Financially responsible
- Impacts of Homeless (aesthetic, trash, hostility, strains on health, cost of providing programs)
- Support for Seniors and Youth lifestyle and health

Wanting to feel stable and necessary

Change the connotation/improve the image of Santa Rosa

- Needs to be maintained and beautified
- Unsafe due to fire hazards, criminal activity, and infrastructure condition
- Negative image of the physical city
- Disheartened/Unsatisfied with city administration

Want to leave the area due to stress, affordability, and hostility

- From fire hazards risk
- Lack for support and fire recovery services
- From criminal activity
- Cleaning up trash, debris, and drug waste

Ideas are intertwined and need new approaches

- Focus on actions and small wins
- Creative and swift policies and implementation
- Accessible mental health resources

Making Social Change

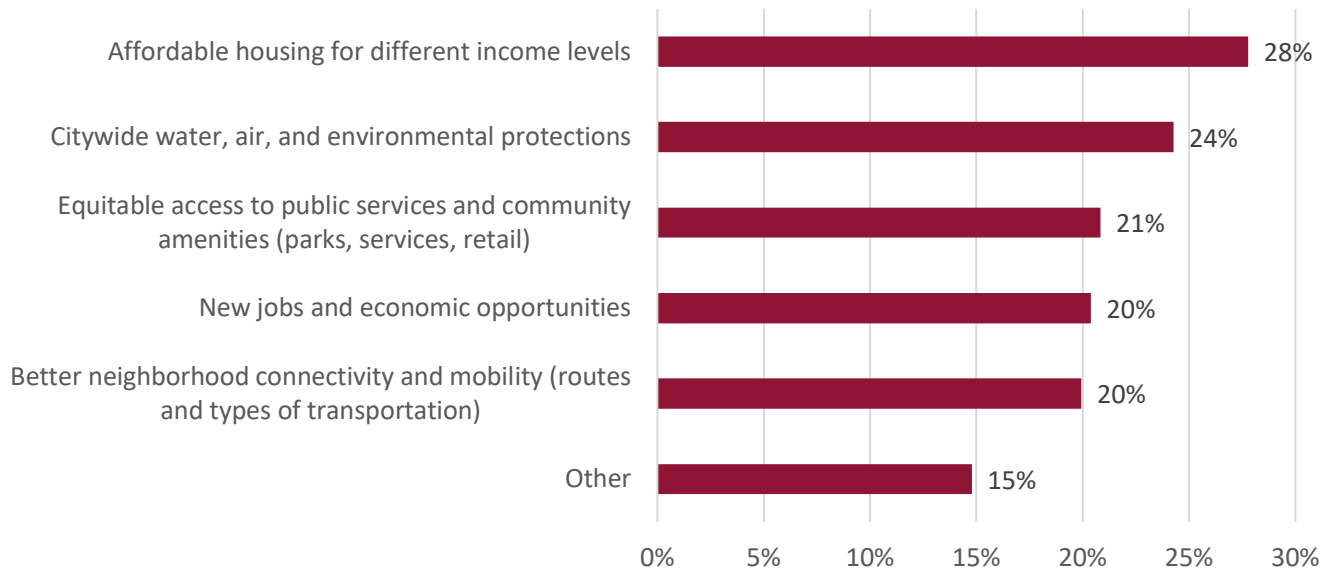
- Improving communication and accountability

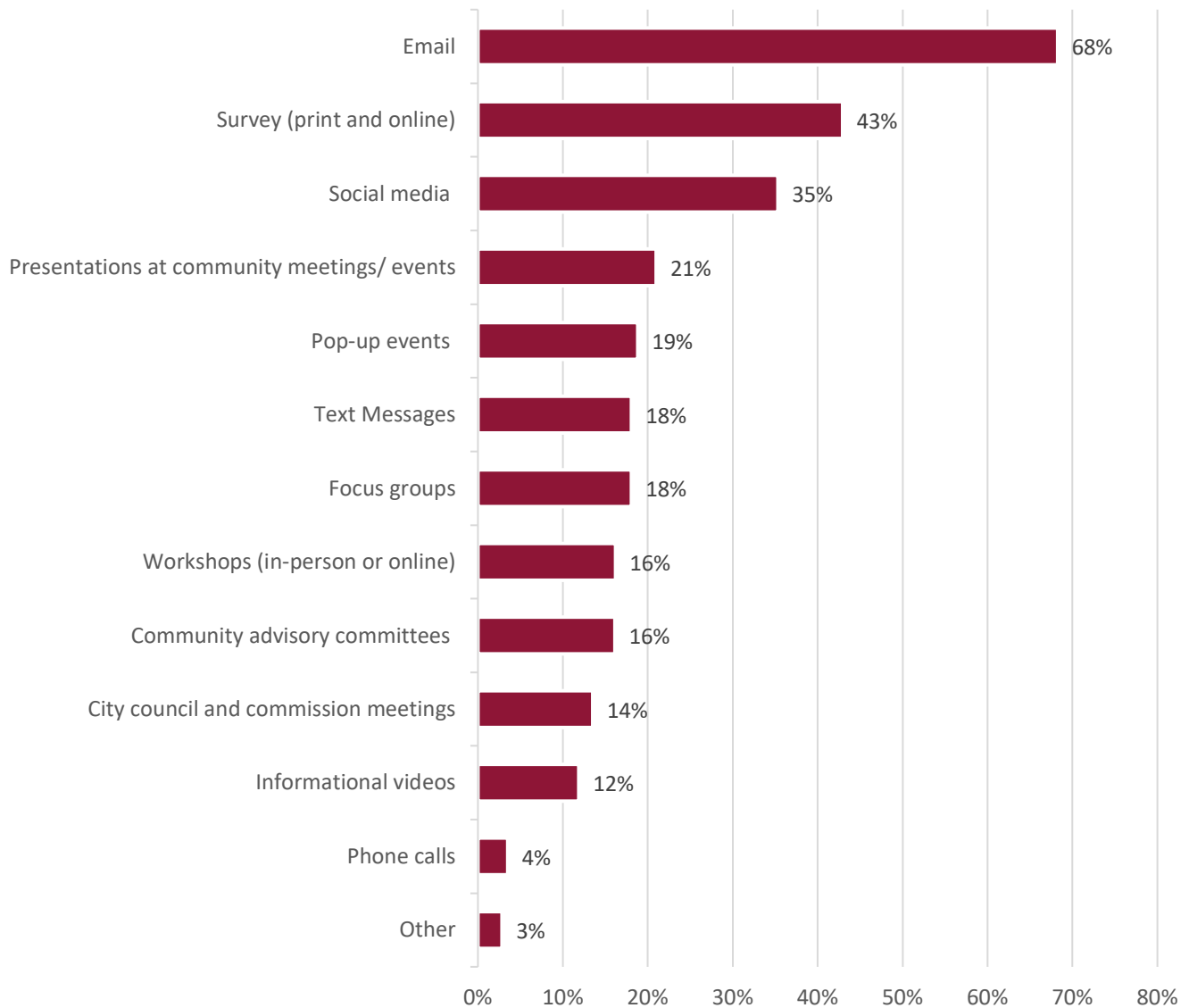

We want to know your community's and your opinion, which would be the best way for you to participate? Select all that apply to you. (N: 3,837)



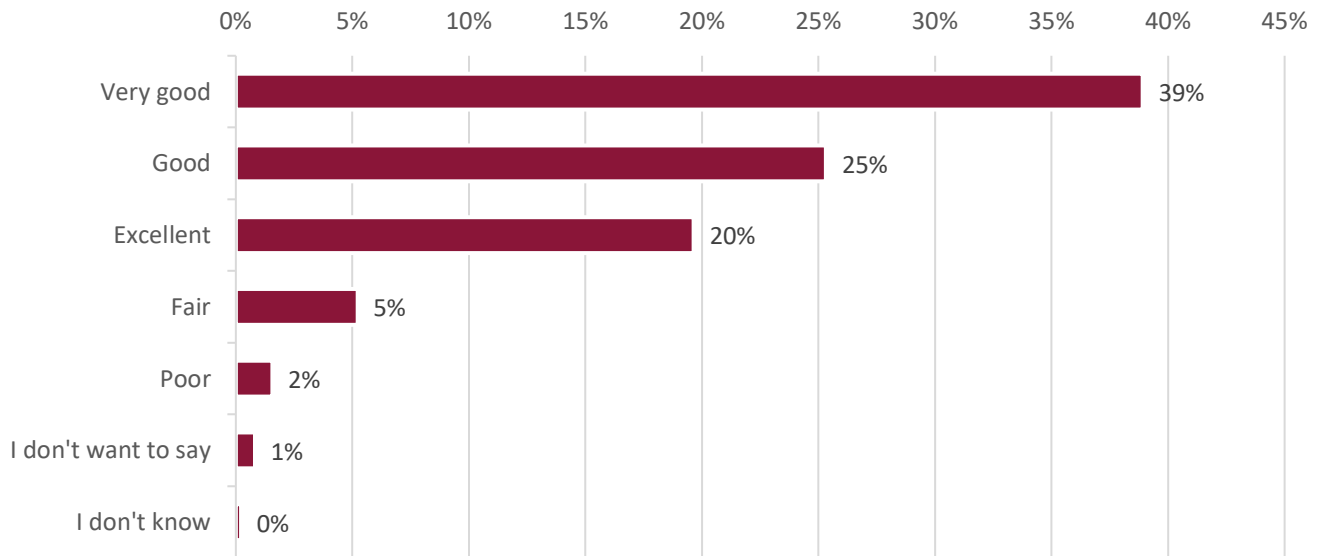

Would you say that in general your health is: (N: 1,228)



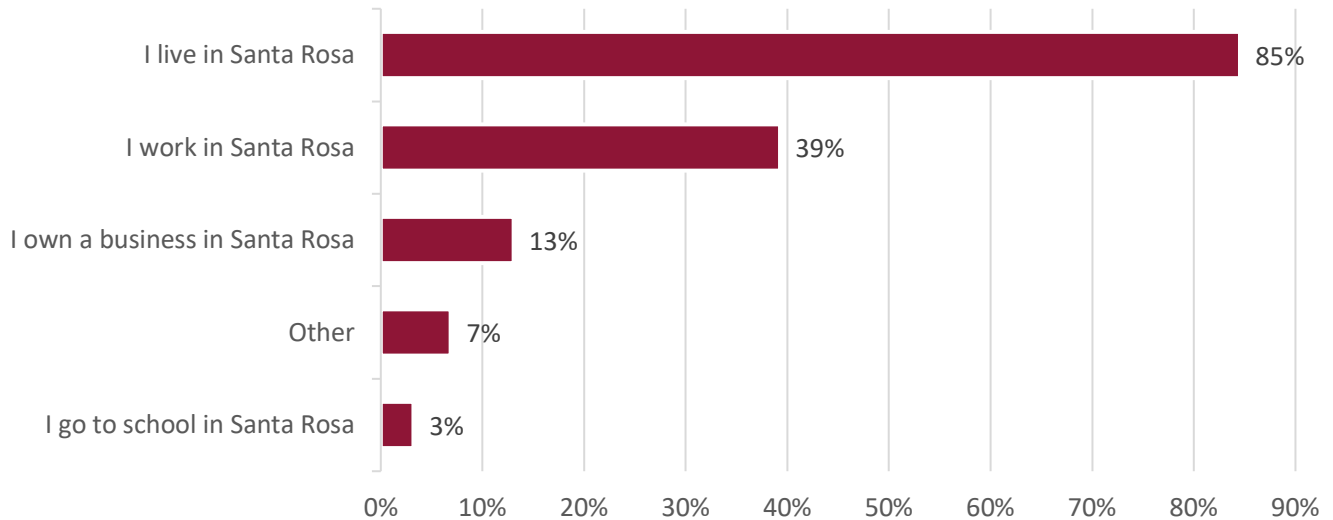

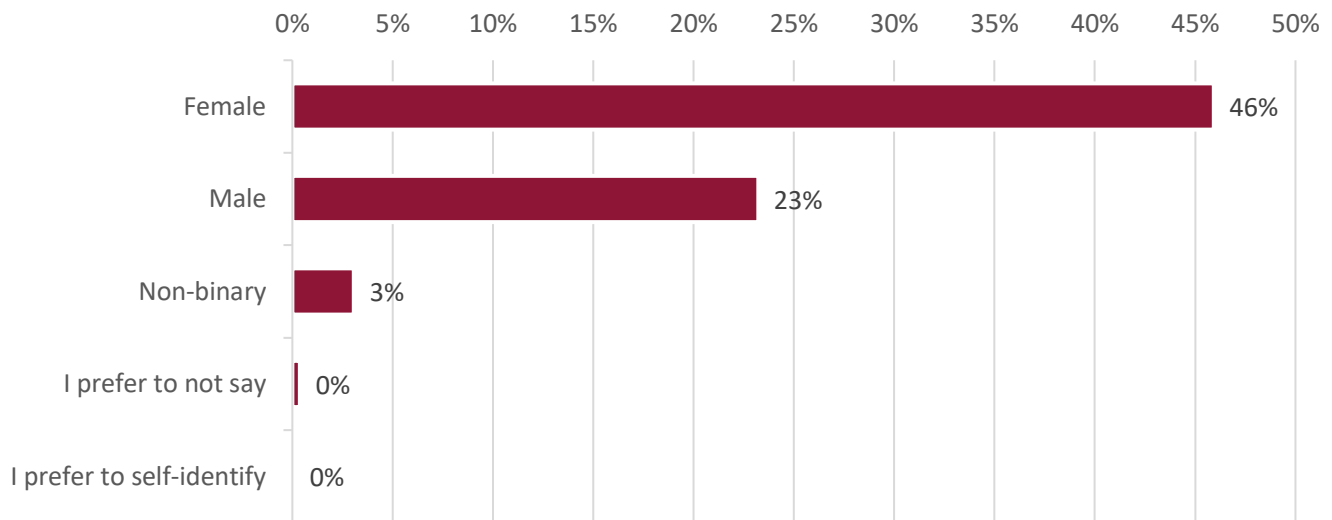

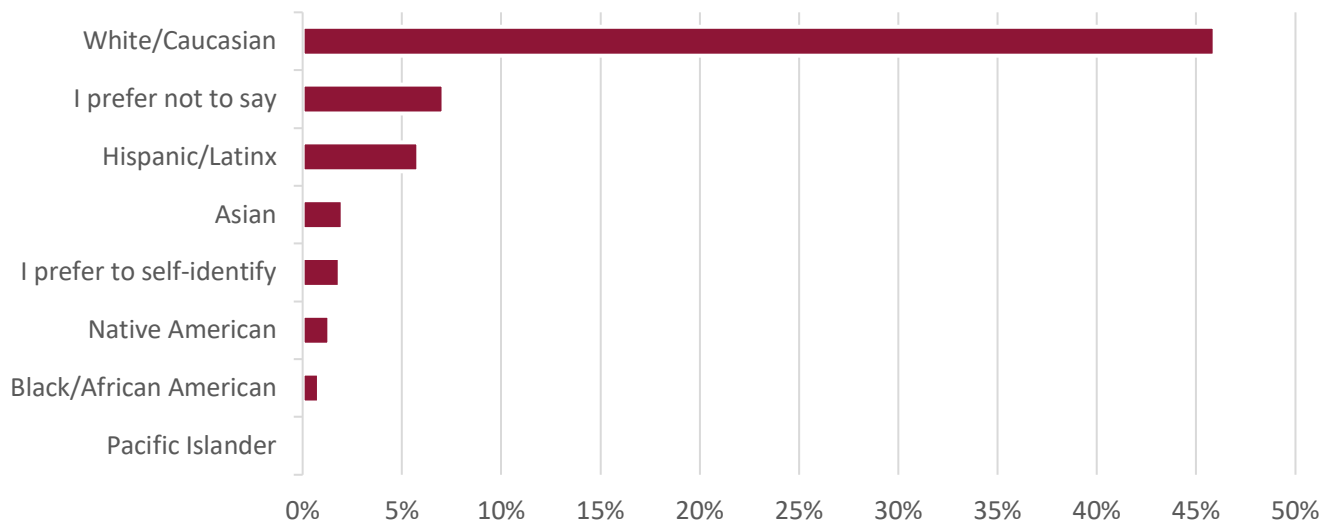
Question 6

What is your race and/or ethnicity? (N:871)

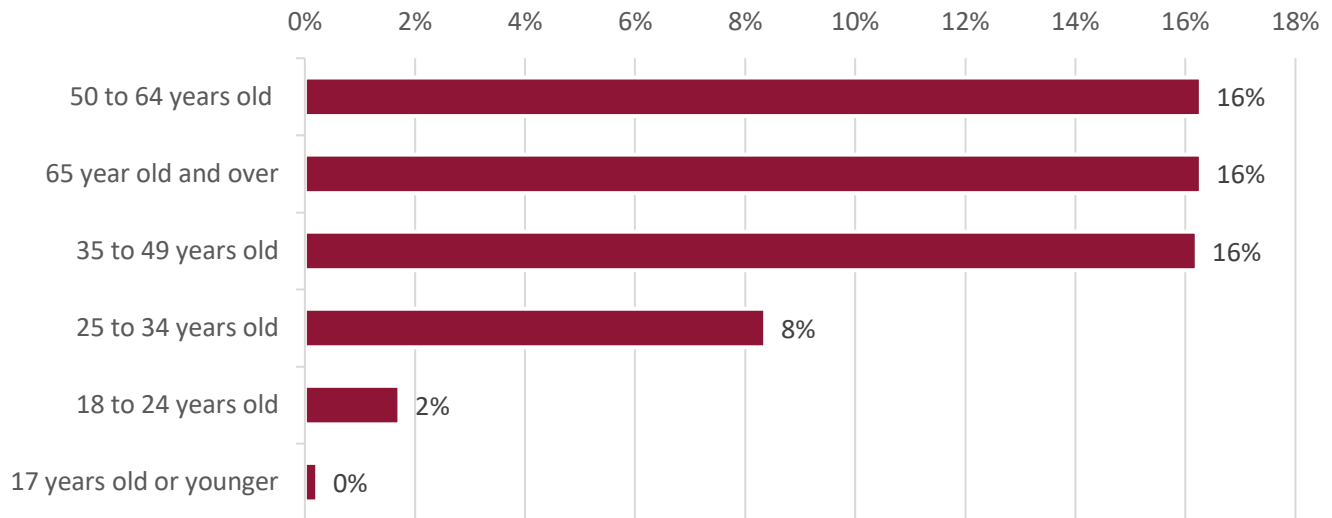

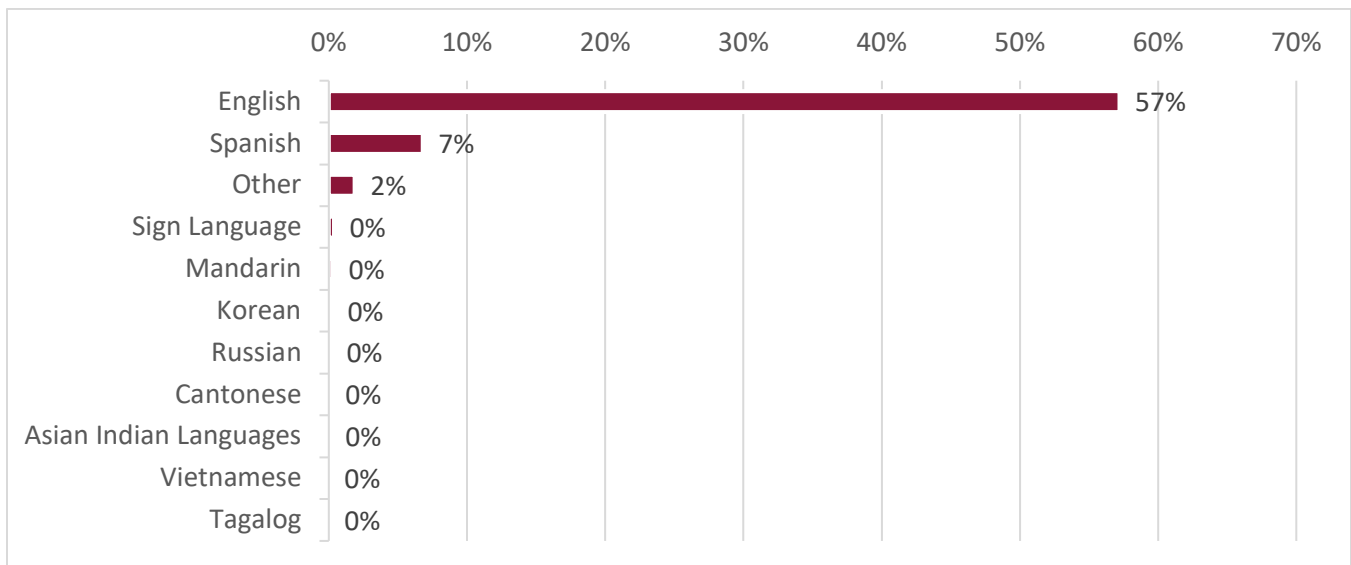
Question 8

What language do you speak at home? Select all that apply. (N: 898)

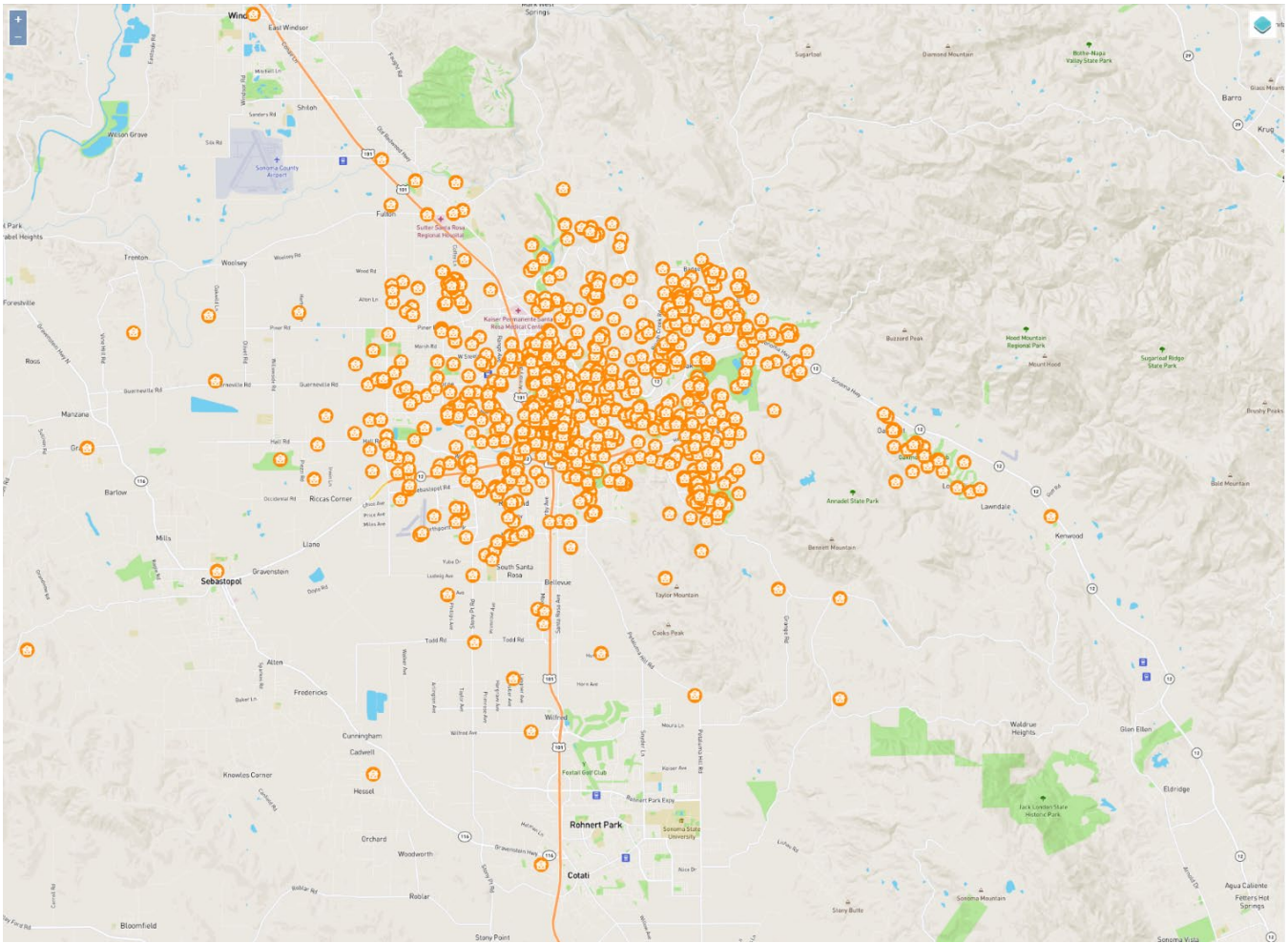

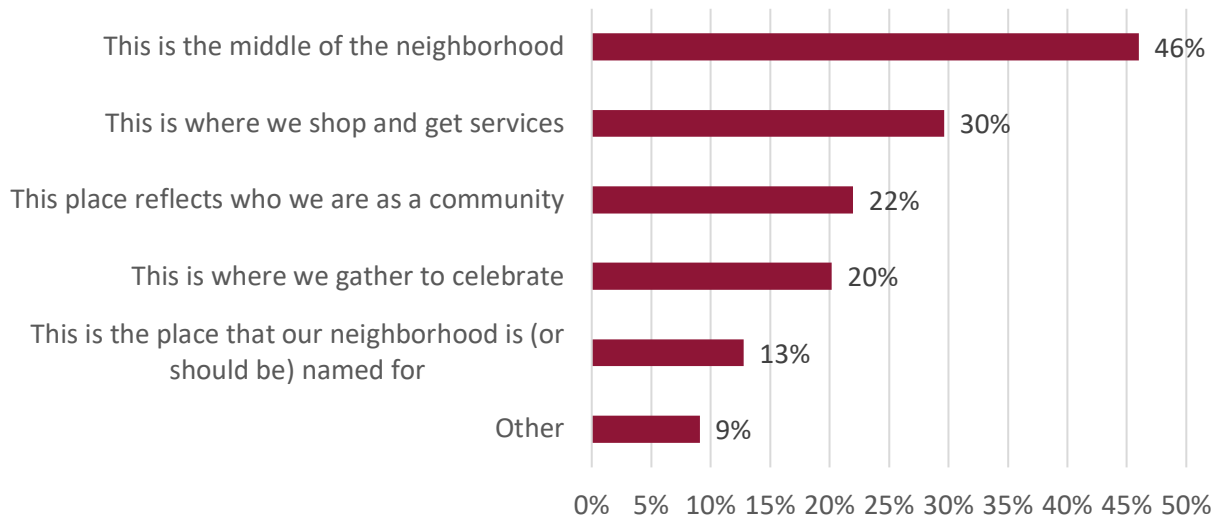
What is the heart of your neighborhood?



A total of 837 pins were added by participants, representing areas within all City Council Districts and neighborhoods within the city. There were also some locations identified outside of city limits.

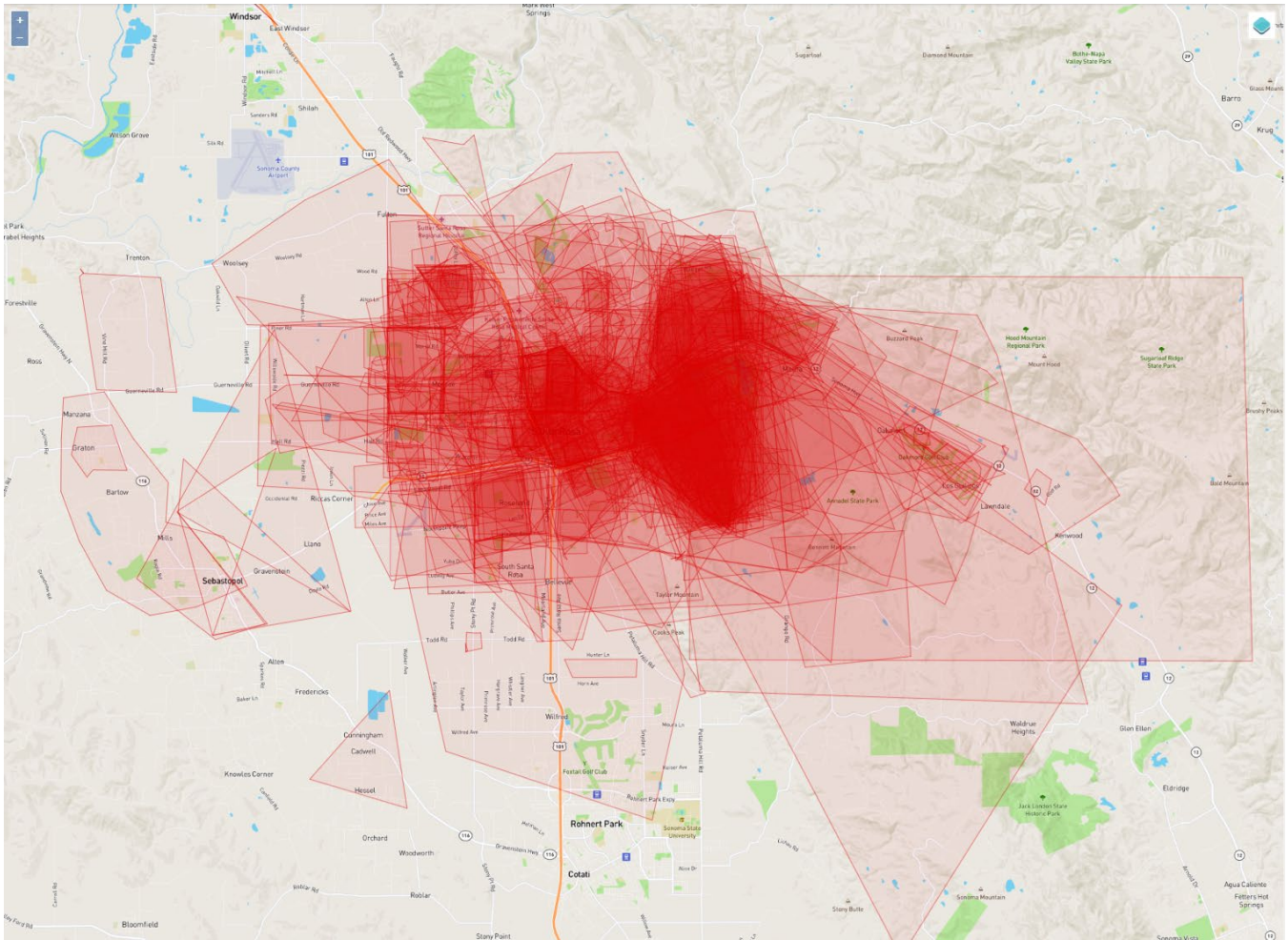
Question 11
